For at least two of our residents, relocation depression, which is triggered by a disruption of routine, was successfully managed through self-care strategies offered through the support and guidance of the Resident Care Coordinators (Sabine Bulow and Vanessa Hunt-Ladouceur). As well, summer student Amélie Gauthier-Gilbert organized and led "Picnic in the Park" to get residents out in nature, improve mood, and foster peer support. All residents are now fully adjusted and love their new apartments!

Kent Gibbons' background really predisposed him to volunteer with Our Harbour. After growing up in Manitoba, he was eventually drawn to the ministry, completing studies in pastoral care at the University of Winnipeg and graduating in educational ministry, pastoral care and social service from the Centre for Christian Studies, then in Toronto. In his final year, his placement activity taught him a lot about the horrors of homelessness and poverty.

Throughout his professional life in Manitoba,

Northern Ontario and New Brunswick, he often worked with the disadvantaged, providing pastoral care. Recently he and his wife. Sylvie, retired to the South Shore. He heard about Our Harbour at his local church and sees it as a good match for his desire to do volunteer work.

His concern for those living with mental illness, built on a lifetime of caring service, is manifest in some of the ideas he brings to the table. He would like to help with a men's group, go walking with residents and share in their lives through his love of music, cooking and sports. He knows that people living with mental illness deserve support, understanding and a path out of homelessness.

After her law degree, Rachel Wang spent more than two decades in the legal industry, most of it in marketing and business development. She is known for helping clients identify and tackle a full range of hurdles and issues. Her broad training, varied experience and dynamic personality, coupled with her enormous patience, all contribute to her work efficiency.

As a first-generation immigrant from China, she has lived both cultures. Her first-hand experiences with the complexities of multicultural communities in Canada have sensitized her to the ongoing needs and challenges of cultural minorities.

Recently she decided to devote more of herself to the community. Her search for an organization that could help her fulfill her goals led her to Our Harbour. The professional staff, friendly residents and enthusiastic volunteers all gave her a sweet sense of belonging. She expects to be an active volunteer and member of such a wonderful team. so that she can use her skillset to support the residents and contribute to Our Harbour's worthy cause.

In addition to a professional career in pharmaceutical marketing (now mostly behind him). Peter MacMillan's past also includes helping to found and grow a local non-profit organization for special needs children and young adults. After taking a breather, he began thinking about new ways to get involved once again in the community.

When the opportunity came up, Peter was keen to join Our Harbour as a volunteer – and to set about working with residents. "I want to continue growing as a person, and for me, that means helping and advocating for members of our community who need a little boost up in life," he said. "At the moment, I am just getting to

Depuis mai, seize résidents de Our Harbour/Le Havre ont trié, lavé les vêtements et le linge de maison et rempli des sacs et des boîtes, aidé à démonter des meubles et vécu avec le stress. la détresse, le sentiment de bouleversement et de désorganisation, des sentiments qui vont de pair avec le fait de déménager.

Ces déménagements ont découlé d'une décision du conseil de ne pas renouveler les baux de certains de nos appartements les plus anciens. La citation ci-dessus a résonné en moi dans le contexte de ces déménagements. Le soutien de nos résidents face aux défis de ces changements a été, comme toujours, au cœur de ce projet.

Après l'anxiété et la peur, les appartements plus récents, plus lumineux, plus frais, et le processus de réorganisation de l'espace personnel et commun ont été une bouffée d'air frais et l'occasion de nouveaux départs. Des emplacements plus verts et plus centraux ont offert l'opportunité de découvrir de nouveaux endroits et activités, de rencontrer de nouvelles personnes, de mettre en place de nouvelles routines et d'explorer un espace différent.

Nouvel espoir.

Bien sûr, ce proiet qui dure depuis des mois (et toujours pas terminé !) n'a pas été sans poser certaines difficultés, vécus directement par l'infatigable équipe de soins de Our Harbour/Le Havre, Sabine Bulow, coordinatrice principale, et Vanessa, coordinatrice des soins aux résidents et, pour cette dernière, pendant sa grossesse!

Cristina Maula, représentante du Conseil des résidents, a interrogé les résidents récemment installés pour recueillir leurs impressions.

Le consensus parmi les onze résidents interrogés sur ce qu'ils apprécient dans leur nouveau foyer réside dans le fait que les appartements sont plus grands et plus lumineux, que l'ambiance est joyeuse et que les commerces de proximité, les banques, les pharmacies, la bibliothèque et les arrêts de bus sont à deux pas. Les résidents apprécient aussi la plus grande intimité de leur nouveau logement et l'atmosphère calme et agréable, les balcons plus spacieux et le fait qu'il n'y ait pas trop d'escaliers à monter!
